Learning objectives

This course will cover the fundamental topics in obesity and anaesthesia. It involves understanding disease processes and consequences, the impact of obesity on the cardiovascular, respiratory system and on the pharmacology of anaesthetic drugs. Other topics covered include: the metabolic syndrome, obstructive sleep apnoea syndrome (OSAS)/obesity hypoventilation syndrome (OHS), fasting guidelines, preoperative assessment and risk reduction strategies, airway and ventilation issues, postoperative analgesia and regional anaesthesia.

The course intends to highlight key issues in anaesthesia for the morbidly obese patients through short sessions and open discussions where each speaker gets 15 minutes to convey the main message to the audience. The final session is dedicated to a clinical discussion and a Kahoot session with questions and answers.
